Guidelines

- No students are to use or wear Smart devices or headphones (any device with Bluetooth capability). Items will be confiscated!
- Hats are permitted outside only
- Haircuts must be moderate, neat, and not hang below the eyebrows or interfere with vision.
- Hair color must be natural, not fun colors.
- No Make-up or fake tattoos on the face.
- Nails should be trimmed short. No nail extensions.
- All shirts must be tucked in to shorts, slacks, skorts, or skirts
- Skirts or shorts are not to be rolled at the waist
- Skirts, shorts, dresses, etc., should be no more than 3" above the knee
- Skirts and dresses should be worn with bike shorts or leggings underneath
- Rainwear does not need to be RHLS. If wearing boots, bring athletic shoes for PE
- Sandals, open-toed shoes, raised heels, Uggs, slippers, or dress shoes are not permitted
- Free Dress Days Emphasis is placed upon cleanliness, appropriateness of dress, and modesty. No spaghetti straps, tank tops, or short shorts. Free Dress Days are a privilege that will remain in effect as long as students do not abuse that privilege.
